God Knows You - How Well do You Know Him?

What a wonderful season of Advent we just experienced! I want to say a very special “Thank you!” to everyone who helped make our sanctuary so beautiful again this Christmas from our decorating committee to everyone who participated in the Hanging of the Green service. The sanctuary was absolutely stunning! Our handbell choir along with the puppet drama presentation reminded us of what the true meaning of Christmas is all about. Our adult choir, musicians, and children’s Whole-Notes choir led us in worship with their Christmas musical presentation, “Hope in a Manger,” that told us of the hope we have in Jesus and eternity. As one attendee commented to me, “That music presentation was uplifting and joyful and the food and fellowship afterward was wonderful.” So a special thank you goes out to our Hospitality Team as well. And didn’t our children do a beautiful job of leading us with their offering of worship in playing bells and chimes and singing? Thanks also to everyone who participated in the Advent readings and candle lighting each Sunday! Each one of you who helped make all of these possible played a significant role in helping this Advent season feel very special. It was a wonderful visual reminder of how each part of the body works to complete and help make the body function.

Now, here we are heading into 2026 with all the opportunities that it holds in store for us. We can’t see or imagine them all but God can! Scripture reminds us that **God is Omniscient**. Omniscience is defined as God having complete and total knowledge of all things for all time. For God to be sovereign over His creation of all things, whether visible or invisible, He has to be all-knowing. His Omniscience is not restricted to any one person in the Trinity. God the Father, God the Son and the Holy Spirit are all by nature Omniscient. John wrote that **God knows everything** in 1 John 3:20. Matthew reminds us that **God knows the smallest details of our lives** as well as everything around us. He mentions that God knows when a sparrow falls or when we lose a single hair in Matthew 10:29-30. According to Isaiah 46:9-10 **God knows everything to the very end of history**. And Psalm 139:4 tells us, **“Even before a word is on my tongue, behold, O Lord, you know it altogether.”**

There is nothing too difficult or challenging for an Omniscient God, and it is on the basis of our faith in Him that we can rest secure in Him. He has known us even before creation and where we would appear in the course of time, and with whom we would interact. He even knew our sin in all its ugliness and wickedness, yet, in love, He set His seal upon us and drew us to that love in Jesus Christ according to Ephesians 1:3-6.

That’s how well God knows you. How well do you know Him? At the beginning of each year, I try to encourage people to get to know God better and one way we get to know Him better is through His love letter to us, His Holy Word, the Bible. In 2024, Debbie used “The Bible Recap” with Tara-Leigh Cobble as her quiet time Bible reading plan for that year. I was impressed by the things I overheard, and I decided to give it a try for my personal quiet time Bible reading in 2025. I enjoyed it so much that I am planning on using it again for this year and highly recommend it if you are looking for an option for yourself. One thing Debbie did this past year was to listen to the Bible being read as she read along with it. It helps when you hit “some of those names” that you often bypass because of their difficulty.

I know there are a lot of wonderful podcasts to listen to and Christian authors to read and I would encourage you to use those as an addition to your daily Bible reading but not in place of it. There are a variety of Bible reading plans available, some are a read through the Bible in a year while others may take a slower approach and read through the Old or New Testament in a year. Perhaps you would like to do an in-depth study of a particular book or books of the Bible. Whatever you choose, remember that perfection is not necessary, but spending time getting to know your Creator who is Omniscient is. A daily quiet time will help prepare, guide and sustain you as you navigate the things that are unknown and unseen to you, but not to Him, in 2026.



A 2024 research publication from Digital Church found that 81% of churchgoers say they consult a church's website before visiting. **Online ministry** is the new front door of the church. It must be welcoming, appealing, and user-friendly. Online ministry goes beyond just our website to also include our live streaming and social media. In today's rapidly changing world, online ministry is not just beneficial, but essential. By embracing the digital frontier, churches can foster a more welcoming, engaging, and intentional environment that meets the needs of both current and future generations. Mill Creek will embrace this new frontier, making the necessary updates and changes to our digital platforms, and ensuring the Gospel message will reach further and farther in the days ahead.

We had made contact with Angela Leedy, the director of the shelter (which is located several blocks north of Trinity Baptist Church). On Saturday morning, we drove into Philly and 100+ presents were unloaded along with many wrapped "toilet paper holders" filled with candy and many clothes, hats, coats and shoes for the children and women. While we were there, Santa read the real Christmas story and he and his elves distributed gifts to about 40 families. The children ranged in age from a few weeks to 12 years old. Each child got to sit on Santa's lap and received an age appropriate gift along with candy and a small toy from Elf Bubby. The mothers "shopped" (for free) at the many tables of clothes and were so appreciative to receive gently used and new items that had been donated. (A big thank you goes out to Josephine and Solomon's Mission for their many donations). Presents and clothes that were not distributed were left with the director of the shelter. We were warmly greeted and thanked by all who conveyed their appreciation to those who sent presents! 
