Working Cooperatively

What a wonderful month March has been as we continue to journey toward Easter Sunday and move through our sermon series, *Can You Believe It?!* Because of the timing of Easter this year and the need to get April's newsletter to you in a timely manner, I am only able to celebrate half of our journey this month. We began the month being led in worship by our handbell choir and what a beautiful offering of praise and worship they presented to us in both of our worship services. Having played in a handbell choir years ago, I understand how technically challenging it can be. I appreciate the hours of rehearsal and dedication of each person in the handbell choir and Marcia Neighbors for leading them each week. As I write this article, we are halfway through our Easter sermon series, and I am excited about all of our Holy Week gatherings coming up beginning with Palm Sunday and culminating on Resurrection Sunday. As the Moravians exclaimed back in the 18th century, "May the Lamb who was slain receive the glory of His suffering."

March also provided me the opportunity to participate on the Roanoke Valley Baptist Association (RVBA) mission trip to Southwest Virginia that is sponsored by the Women's Missionary Union of the RVBA. One of the things that makes this trip unique is that it is not just a Mill Creek trip, but one we do in cooperation with other Baptist churches that identify with the RVBA. You will have the opportunity to read about the various ways in which we ministered to others through Book Net, construction projects and the Gate City Food pantry later in this newsletter. It is amazing what all God did through our efforts while on mission that week! Although I was one of nineteen people from Mill Creek and one of forty-six people total, that number does not reflect the total number of people who actually participated in the trip.

- If you gave books or helped to organize books, you participated in this trip.
- If you helped to make ditty bags for us to take and give hygiene supplies to each student, you participated in this trip.
- If you gave financially to our VBS offering last July which helped us purchase Bibles to give to students who wanted one, you participated in this trip.
- If you gave financially on our "Ditty Bag Sunday", you participated in this trip.
- If you prayed for our team and the others who were ministering to those whom we went to serve, you participated in this trip.

When you combine these efforts with people from more than eighteen other churches, because some churches helped in these ways without someone from the church going on the trip, you can begin to get a clearer picture of the cooperative aspect of this trip.

One of the beautiful aspects of our church is that we not only financially support the cooperative program through our giving, but we also cooperate with others through our actions. When we give financially to the cooperative program, we support a variety of missions and ministries that are a part of the RVBA, the Baptist General Association of Virginia and the Southern Baptist Convention. Other churches do the same and as a result of our "cooperating" together, we are able to accomplish so much more than Mill Creek could on our own. When we "cooperate" through our physical participation in things like this trip, or as we have for the past several years, worked with Villa Heights Baptist Church in making and sharing VBS decorations, we are able to accomplish more than we could on our own.

As I reflect on this mission trip and the spirit of cooperation that helped to make the trip successful, I am reminded of the early church in Acts 2. They worked together. They worshiped together. They shared what they had with one another and helped to meet the needs of one another. And as a result, the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved. God has created us to be in community with one another and to work cooperatively with one another. The more I learn about Mill Creek, the more I realize this is part of our DNA. This church has been seeking to do this since her inception in 1804 and I pray we never lose sight of this calling to serve and minister in Jesus' name. May the Lamb who was slain continue to receive the glory of His suffering through our cooperative efforts until His return.



I was 56 years old and had the world by the tail. Things were moving along smoothly for me. I had a great wife, family, job, and faith...so how could anything go wrong? After all, I was bulletproof, but that was right up to the day that a large lump showed up in the right side of my neck and would not go away. I finally gave in and went to see my doctor and the referral process started to determine I had throat cancer.

Well, it turns out that lots of us know the feeling when that diagnosis of the big C comes before us. It's flat out terrifying and I immediately did what most people do when something BAD happens. I hit my knees and talked to God like I never had before.

My wife, Sharon, and I were attending another church at the time, and let me just say they were a praying group of Christians, especially our Sunday school class.

Lots of people say when something bad happens, "I don't want anybody to know." That was not me. I wanted the world to know, because I understood that the more people that knew, more prayers would take place. I wanted God to hear my name as much as possible.

Treatments were tough, chemotherapy and radiation. Many of you know firsthand, and some of you are experiencing it now.

I have always believed in prayer, but never more so than when my life was on the line. I have always believed in good doctors and good medicine, but let's face it, none of that would have been placed in my path, if God had not placed it there.

I received cards, calls, emails from people I didn't even know, but that was fine by me, because I knew those prayer warriors were on a mission, and I was the beneficiary.

Thankfully, I am now 10 years past what the doctors labeled "cancer-free". In my world, the doctors can tell you that the cancer has left your body, but those of us that have experienced it, know that it never leaves your mind.

I am so grateful for the power of prayer, God, and a wife who never left my side through all of it. God truly blessed me with a miracle.

The moral to this story is prayer works. It's a powerful tool. If you tell someone you will pray for them, don't let it just be lip service. Follow through and pray for them. God hears our prayers and answers them, too. Just ask me sometime and I will be glad to share.

Report of Blessings from SW VA Mission Trip 2024

Early in March, 46 people from 13 churches in the Roanoke Valley shared God's love with our Virginia neighbors in far SW Virginia. This spring mission trip has taken place for over 20 years and is organized by the WMU of the Roanoke Valley Baptist Association. There were 19 from Mill Creek who participated. They included: Curtis Akers, Dan Bowser, John Caldwell, Donna Crawford, Judy Deel, Mary Deel, Chad Epperly, Don Epperly, Laura Epperly, Jill Ferguson, Matt Ferguson, Ruth Fix, Rene Jeter, Donnie Johnson, Susan Johnson, Bruce Lightner, Bill Potter, Danny Quirin, and Debbie Rago. This outreach included giving books, Bibles and toiletry bags to school children, repairing homes, and working at the Gate City Food Pantry.

BookNet Facts for 2024

- The team made visits to schools in Lee County (Rose Hill, St Charles, Flatwoods, Dryden), Scott County (Yuma, Hilton, Dungannon), and Russell County (Copper Creek, Swords Creek, Ft Blackmore).
- About 1800 students in Grades Pre-K Grade 7 were visited throughout the week.
- More than 6,000 books were shared at 10 schools!
- In addition to in-school visits, boxes of books were dropped off at 4 additional schools (Elydale, Shoemaker, Duffield, Nickelsville) and extra books were given to St Charles.



- Prior to the trip about 15 volunteers from a dozen local churches worked to sort and process books during January and February.
- Books are stored at Mill Creek in the basement of the Fellowship House.
- The collection of books and monetary donations to purchase books will be ongoing and processing books for distribution in 2025 will begin in a few months.

Health Products Given in Cloth Ditty Bags

- Ditty Bags with shampoo, comb, toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, washcloth were given to over 1500 students (deodorant to Grades 5-7) .
- Mill Creek's donations for Ditty Bag supplies were many. Cloth bags were sewn and over \$2600 was given to help purchase supplies. Thank you!
- It is not too early to start sewing cloth Ditty Bags for 2025! Just gather your cotton fabric and follow these simple directions! Remember to plan for prints for boys, as well as girls. Completed bags will be accepted at any time. Donations of cotton fabric are also welcomed. About 1600 bags will be needed for next spring's mission trip to visit the students in Southwest Virginia. 

Construction Projects for 2024

- Work on the two homes was organized and planned by Tony Johnson, missionary for SW VA Partnership.
- Two homes received needed improvements. One had rotted floor boards removed and replaced with vinyl flooring. Another had bathroom upgrades made to meet the needs of a woman who had suffered a stroke and was in need of a handicapped accessible shower.
- Each team gave a Mill Creek prayer blanket to the homeowner and prayed with them.



Food Pantry

• Several from the team volunteered to work at the Gate City Food Pantry. Their work included sorting donations, packing bags, stocking shelves, visiting, and praying with clients. About 100 clients were helped during the two days.





History of BookNet Ministry

Back in 1999 the WMUV called together a group of concerned women, the Great Commission Teachers Task Force. This group was keenly aware of the illiteracy issues in our state. This task force's mission was to combat those illiteracy issues through tutoring students who were struggling to help them improve their reading skills, and tutoring adults who needed to obtain their GED. This group mobilized churches in the region to participate in this mission. Valerie Carter, at that time the Associate of Christian Social Ministries for WMUV, shared with the task force the importance of books especially new books that children could own. From her presentation, BookNet was born. This idea of a book network was a new concept for them at that time but today, it is a labor of love and one that has grown over the years. The first BookNet mission trip to Southwest Virginia was back in July of 2004 and was comprised of men and women from the Roanoke Valley Baptist Association. This team set up in a park across from a school in St. Charles and began handing out books that had been collected for this trip. The school principal came out to inquire about what they were doing and then asked if they would come during the following school year.

While the BookNet ministry remains a statewide project of the WMUV and RVBA, our church is an integral part of the BookNet ministry. When it first began over 20 years ago, it was created by the state WMU to get books into the hands of children and to serve an underserved area in the state of Virginia, the Appalachian Mountain region. As all great initiatives go, it evolved over time and today this labor of love where blessings abound includes a few more parts than it did originally. Today, in addition to the team that goes into the schools, there is a construction team and a food pantry team. As is common for any good mission trip, there is much work that is done to prepare for the trip itself. Roanoke Valley Baptist Association churches collect new and gently used books that a team of teachers and librarians then sort into correct grade appropriate groups in advance of the mission trip. It takes many working together to accomplish the ministry of BookNet.


